RE: MPHS – Student Positive COVID-19 Test

Dear Miller Place School District Community,

The Miller Place School District has been notified by a **high school parent** that their child tested positive for COVID-19 on Monday, October 5, 2020.

**The student has not been in school since Tuesday, September 29, 2020.** The student was not feeling symptomatic when in our school building. Therefore, there is **no District contact tracing** by the Suffolk County Department of Health and no action needed by the District as the 48-hour “look-back period has been exceeded.”

Probable close contacts are individuals who have been in the 6 foot proximity of the tested positive student, for at least 10 minutes, without wearing a mask. In addition, probable close contacts are those who were near the student 48 hours prior to the individual becoming symptomatic or testing positive. SCDOH will identify those close contacts, outside the District, who should remain at home for a 14 day quarantine period.

The student who tested positive will not be permitted to return to school until they provide the District with medical documentation clearing them to return to school – which also includes a negative COVID-19 test result.

The health and safety of our students and staff remains a priority of our District. It is important to be reminded that symptoms of COVID-19 are similar to seasonal flu with symptoms that may include fever, coughing, vomiting, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose, headache, losing the sense of smell and/or taste, as well as feeling lethargic.

If your child, or any member of your household, is exhibiting any sign or symptom of COVID-19 please immediately seek medical attention.
