RE: NCRMS – Student Positive COVID-19 Test

Dear Miller Place School District Community,

The Miller Place School District has been notified by the Suffolk County Department of Health (SCDOH) that a North Country Road Middle School student has tested positive for COVID-19. **The student has not been in school since Tuesday, October 13, 2020 and was not feeling symptomatic when in our school building.** Over the weekend the District and SCDOH completed the data gathering and investigative processes. The SCDOH has advised the District that no further action is needed by the District at this time.

Please remember, probable close contacts are individuals who have been in the 6 foot proximity of the tested positive student, for at least 10 minutes, without wearing a mask. Should SCDOH have identified close contacts, they would have contacted those individuals, who should remain at home for a 14-day quarantine period.

The student who tested positive will not be permitted to return to school until they are released by SCDOH and in accordance with the guidelines detailed in our return to school protocols.

The health and safety of our students and staff remains a priority of our District. It is important to be reminded that symptoms of COVID-19 are similar to seasonal flu with symptoms that may include fever, coughing, vomiting, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose, headache, losing the sense of smell and/or taste, as well as feeling lethargic.

If your child, or any member of your household, is exhibiting any sign or symptom of COVID-19 please immediately seek medical attention.
