

# NORTH COUNTRY ROAD MIDDLE SCHOOL

Dear Parents and/or Guardians,

With the new school year underway, many of us are back to a more structured routine that keeps us quite busy. As we return to this rigorous schedule, please try to find some time each day to talk with your child about school. Middle school is a time and place where your child will grow in many different ways. Always feel free to call or email your child's teachers or the main office with any concerns that you might have.

Another important element of our program is to continue the discussion with students in reference to the **Dignity For All Students Act**, legislation designed to provide support in order to maintain a safe and healthy school climate. Our middle school provides an approach to combat peer mistreatment through education, providing programs and lessons as part of our Character Education program, as well as our daily learning experiences. You can always refer to our district's Code of Conduct, which is available online, or speak to our building administration for more specific information about The Dignity Act or any matter that pertains to health and safety.

This year students in grades 6 through 8 will participate in the **New York State Assessments** in English and Math to determine levels of academic achievement. Some of our students in grade 8 will challenge the **New York State Assessment** in Science, while others will take the Earth Science Regents Exam during Final's Week. Our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students that have been selected to take Algebra I are not responsible for the NYS Grade 8 Math Assessment due to their necessary attention to the Regents exam. All of these exams are important determinants of academic achievement and indicate when academic intervention is necessary.

We will begin the **Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA™) Measures of Academic Progress® (MAP®)** computerized assessments to measure student achievement in grades 6 – 8 in early October. Each assessment takes approximately 45-60 minutes, and the turnaround time to evaluate results is minimal. There is no test preparation that is required at home or at school prior to the NWEA™ assessment. This year, students will participate in a fall, winter, and spring administration session in English Language Arts and Math. NWEA™ has no correlation to or association with any “high stakes” testing. The data will be reviewed by your child’s classroom teacher and building administration only to inform instruction and speak to individual progress in the classroom.

We have met with all of the students to discuss expectations for the 2019-2020 school year during our **September orientations** on the first day of school. This discussion included a review of the district's Code of Conduct, which includes the Attendance and Eligibility policies. If you have not reviewed this information with your child, please refer to the NCRMS student agenda handbook where this information is outlined.

In order to ensure that our student body is prepared in the case of an emergency, we have begun a series of **fire evacuation drills**. Students are instructed to follow the instruction of the adult (teacher, administrator, nurse, aide, etc.) in order to leave the building safely. We have also begun a series of **lockdown drills**, which have been designed in cooperation with our Suffolk County Police Department Resource Officer.

All of our students participate in the **First Student Bus Safety program**, which includes a series of drills using the different methods of evacuation from the bus, as well as some strategies that will emphasize safe practices. Students are reminded about the significance of safety and appropriate behavior on the school bus. Building administration has emphasized the fact that our adopted slogan, “Not in our school” applies to our daily bus ride as well.

You should have already received, reviewed, signed, and returned the following important documents to school with your child. If not, please call the main office and request the information: **Census Verification Form/Computer Use Permission Form and School-Wide Discipline Contract**.

NCRMS has been registered for the **A+ School Rewards program**, a partnership between schools and Stop & Shop supermarkets. Our middle school will have the opportunity to earn cash through Stop & Shop A+ School Rewards Program. All you have to do is Log on to [www.stopandshop.com/aplus](http://www.stopandshop.com/aplus) to register online, or dial 1-877-275-2758 to register your card over the phone. After you register your card, each shopping trip at Stop & Shop using your Stop & Shop Card earns CASH for our school! Each month, the amount of CASH awarded will be updated on the Stop & Shop website. You can track the amount of points you earn for our school by checking your grocery receipt and online when you create an account at [www.stopandshop.com](http://www.stopandshop.com). Our school will receive a check at the end of the program. Remember, even if you registered your card last year, you must re-register this year for our school to receive credit. Please be sure to register your card to benefit the North Country Road Middle School using ID # 07826.

Please be aware of the **extra-curricular clubs and activities** that are offered at the Middle School. A listing of these clubs can be found in the student agenda. Students should listen to the morning announcements for meeting dates and times. We also have posted a weekly update to our club schedules and events on our **NCR FYI page**. The link can be found on our NCRMS page within the district website. For example, our **Student Government** is off to a

great start, and is still accepting members if you are interested. Please remember that students must have their own transportation to the morning events (i.e. Wiffle ball, Badminton, and a.m. extra help). We will continue our **3:35 bus** for students who attend the clubs/extracurricular activities on a daily basis. Students will be supervised after the extracurricular activity ends until the bus arrives for departure. Our **4:30 p.m. bus run**, which is intended for, but not limited to athletics will also continue on a daily basis.
