These meetings are shorter than the 11th grade planning meetings; they begin the discussion of the college process with students and parents.

In absence of a face to face meeting, we would like to provide you with the details on the information we would cover.

- Review of [graduation requirements](#). Local requirements can be found in our [course offering guide](#), pages 6-8.
- Review of student's grades and course requests for 2020-2021, which can be found in your School Tool account. To view course requests: Click on SCHEDULE tab, click drop down of VIEW, select COURSE SELECTIONS, click drop down for 2020-2021.
- Review of Honor Roll (89.5), High Honor Roll (94.5) and [National Honor Society requirements](#) (90+ overall average, involvement in clubs, activities, community service, leadership.)
- PSAT information- generally, we review scores (which you received in December via College Board, if you took them). If you have not done so already, [please link your College Board account with your Khan Academy](#) to prepare for another PSAT as well as for the SATs. Please be sure to take the PSAT again in October 2020. PSAT is a practice SAT as well as a [National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test](#) (for juniors).
- Reminder of our Attendance Policy, referenced on [page 5 of our Course Offerings Guide](#).
- [Extra-curricular activities](#)- reminder of the importance of staying involved. Activities are an important part of the college application process; remember it's "Quality, not Quantity" that matters.
- Career exploration- review of Naviance Career Interest Profiler that was taken in school the week of March 9th. Please remember Naviance can be accessed through Microsoft 365 from any computer or device. (myapps.microsoft.com).
- College planning- you can begin to use the Naviance Advanced College Search feature, as demonstrated through classroom presentations, to start to explore colleges. You can utilize virtual tours on college/university websites to start exploring campuses.
